

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Who is eligible to attend the A.P. Torrence Summer Youth Leadership Academy (APTYLA)?

Participants are selected from those who apply. All seriously interested in participating in APTYLA should complete the online registration at aptyla2019.eventbrite.com or download and complete the registration form at thetruthteller.org. Your registration must be received by The Truth Teller Inc. along with the \$50 non-refundable registration fee on or before 11:59 PM EDT on Friday, May 24, 2019.

Q: Who is A.P. Torrence?

APTYLA is named after the late Dr. Andrew P. Torrence. He was the former president of Tennessee State University (1968-1974) and provost of Tuskegee University (1975-1980). Dr. Torrence was a lifelong educator and believed in the value of education. He is the father of Reverend Kenneth G. Torrence, founder and CEO of The Truth Teller Inc.

Q: What is considered in choosing students for APTYLA?

There are several factors taken into consideration when selecting students. They include but are not limited to:


- Quality and completeness of responses on the registration form.
- Good academic and citizenship standing.
- Current openings for the Academy.

Q: How old do I have to be to register for APTYLA?

APTYLA is open to students in the metropolitan Atlanta area who are 10 to 15 years old (or rising 5th to 10th grader for the fall 2019 school year).

Q: Why is APTYLA only for African American males?

The Academy specifically addresses the needs of our community's most vulnerable and at-risk youth.



Q: How many participants will be selected for APTYLA?

Due to space limitations, only 25 participants will be selected for the program. In all cases, the selection of students for APTYLA is the final decision of Reverend Kenneth G. Torrence, founder and CEO of The Truth Teller Inc. As soon as the selection of participants is final, all who have applied will be notified by email. Please use an email address that you will check regularly.

Q: What will I be doing at APTYLA?

First and foremost, you will learn leadership and life skills. You will participate in group activities, mentorship, and interact with local civic and community leaders. You will also spend time discovering how to communicate effectively, address and resolve personal conflict, as well as community issues and problems.

Q: Will lunch be provided?

Yes. Breakfast and lunch will be provided to all participants.

Q: Where is APTYLA held?

This year, APTYLA will be held at John Lewis Invictus Academy, 1890 Donald Lee Hollowell Parkway, Atlanta, Georgia 30318.

Q: Do I have to provide my own transportation?

Yes.

Q: Do I have to attend all five days?

Yes, it is required that you attend all days of APTYLA and are able to be there all day each day.
